3. The registration is valid for dealing of Batteries under the Batteries (Management and Handling) Rules, 2001 Amendment Rules, 2010.
4. The registration is valid upto **04-03-2026**
5. The registration is subject to the conditions stated below and sub conditions as may be specified in the rules in force under the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986.
6. In case of illegal dealing other than mentioned in the Batteries (Management and Handling) Rules, 2001 Amendment Rules, 2010 is subject to cancellation of dealership.

**General Conditions:-**

- 1 The registration holder shall comply with provisions of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 and the rules made thereunder. The registration or its renewal shall be produced for inspection at the request of an officer authorized by the Maharashtra Pollution Control Board at the place of Dealership.
- 2 The dealer shall not rent, lend, sell, transfer or otherwise transport the hazardous wastes without obtaining prior permission of the Maharashtra Pollution Control Board.
- 3 An application for the renewal of registration shall be made as laid down under provision of the Batteries (Management and Handling) Rules, 2001 Amendment Rules, 2010. It is binding upon dealer to take prior permission of the Maharashtra Pollution Control Board in case to close down the dealership.


**Responsibilities of Dealer. –**

- 1 It is the responsibility of dealer to ensure that the used batteries are collected back as per the Schedule against new batteries sold.
- 2 The dealer shall ensure that the used batteries are collected back are of similar type and specifications as that of the new batteries sold and has to give appropriate discount for every used battery return by the consumer.
- 3 The dealer shall file timely half - yearly returns of the sale of new batteries and buy-back of old batteries to the manufacturer in FORM - V by 31st May and 30th November of every year.
- 4 The dealer shall ensure safe transportation of collected batteries to the designated collection centers or to the registered recyclers.
- 5 The dealer shall ensure that no damage is caused to the environment during storage and transportation of used batteries.
- 6 The Board has reserved its right to cancel the registration at any time for no action under the provision of the Batteries (Management and Handling) Rules, 2001 Amendment Rules, 2010. But, registration granted to the dealer shall be cancelled after extending opportunity of hearing to the dealer.



- 4 This certificate of registration stands automatically cancelled, if any of the conditions stipulated above are found to be violated.
- 5 You shall apply for renewal of Registration 30 days before expiry of existing registration.
- 6 Dealer of Batteries shall submit Bank Guarantee in favour of Regional Officer, Nashik of Rs. 10,000/- valid up to 31.12.2022 towards compliance of Batteries (Management and Handling) Rules, 2001 Amendment Rules, 2010 within a period of Fifteen days from the receipt of this letter of registration. In Case, Dealer of Batteries fail to collect back 90% of used batteries from the customers and send to Recycler through Manufacturer as per the Batteries (Management and Handling) Rules, 2001 Amendment Rules, 2010, Board will have no option than to forfeit the Bank Guarantee and to take appropriate action as may deem fit and proper in this case.
